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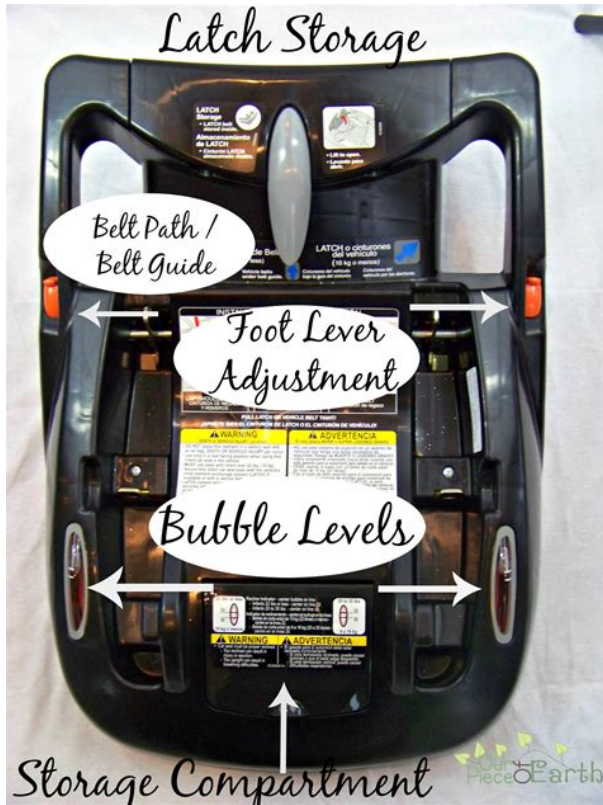

It is a lightweight, travel friendly and sturdy. The Combi Shuttle 35 is equipped with 360 degrees of protection for front, rear, and side impact collisions. Having the anti-rebound bar on the carrier allows you to install the seat without its base to any car and still have all the same safety features. It features the Combi TruSafe Side Impact Protection, which offers a head restraint with deep side walls and a layer of EPS foam to distribute crash energy away from your baby's head, neck, and spine. You can also install this seat without the base. This way, you can keep the base in your car and if your baby ever needs to ride in someone else's car, you can install the car seat without the base. You can also purchase the Combi Shuttle Travel System, which includes the car seat and the Shuttle Stroller in a matching set. The top of your baby's head should be at least 1 inch below the top of the headrest. Keep in mind that you can only use one method of attachment. Do not install the car seat base with both LATCH and seat belt. This car seat is a great value, especially considering all the premium features it offers. It comes with a manufacturer's one-year warranty. You'll likely spend hours researching the best car seats. You can start with a convertible car seat right off the bat or opt for an infant car seat and upgrade to a convertible as your baby gets older. Personally, I prefer the convenience that an infant seat offers. Today I'm excited to share with you my review of the Combi Shuttle Infant Car Seat. Recently, Combi sent me their Shuttle Infant Car Seat at no cost, to facilitate a review. When it arrived, I took it out of the box and it was ready to go. No assembly is required; just remove the plastic and begin installation into your car. I despise having to leave my infants in car seats for longer than necessary, I'd rather be holding or wearing my baby. However, this seat is so plush and cozy, it feels like they're nestled into a cloud. The adjustable head restraint with deep side walls and a layer of energy absorbing foam distributes crash forces away from your infant's head, neck and spine which not only offers safety but comfort too. With the stroller seat in a reclined position I was able to easily snap the car seat into the Combi Twin Cosmo Stroller, just like you do with the car seat's base. Removing the car seat from the stroller also works the same way it does to remove it from the base. Simply squeeze the red release handle located on the upper back side of the car seat, directly under the shade's base. My favorite features of the Combi Shuttle Infant Car Seat The stability and protection from the elements with the shade The easy to install car seat base The easy to use premium, pushbutton LATCH connectors The support, comfort and safety for baby I love that this car seat accommodates the littlest of littles, up to even my hefty 10 month old baby and beyond. Over the years Thrifty Nifty Mommy has expanded to a team of 4 writers. You're awesome for doing it. Gone are the days when your biggest decision regarding your baby's first carseat was whether you wanted the blue plaid cover with the front harness adjuster or the ugly brown cover with rear adjuster that matched your vehicle upholstery. The Shuttle 33 is the most recent version and is the model being reviewed here. Unfortunately, I do not own or have access to an original Shuttle 8087 model so I am unable to provide any comparative remarks. However, I do want to point out that there are many differences between this 33 model and its predecessor. This isn't a case of a manufacturer just slapping new labels, with expanded weight limits, on an existing seat. The exception is the Coccoro Flash stroller frame which can only accept the Combi Coccoro convertible seat. The original Combi Shuttle bases are NOT compatible with the newer Shuttle 33. The Sand pattern is ivory and black and the entire cover is made from the same mesh fabric. This particular cover is wellpadded and also machine washable, a big bonus in my book. However, I was able to get the harness snug around the doll albeit with some difficulty, and that is definitely the most important factor. Also, the chest clip was in the correct position even though it was pushed down as far as it would go and due to its narrow design it held the harness straps close enough together to keep them over the doll's very narrow shoulders. Unfortunately, the "seat cushion" insert isn't very thick so it does little to raise the doll up any higher. In real life, a diaper would take up some of this room but with a small newborn you may still need to tuck a rolledup washcloth or cloth diaper in that area to prevent slumping. There were still several inches of shell height above the doll's head which indicates a significant amount of growing room left.

The biggest issues that I can foresee with a larger child using the Shuttle 33 is loading and unloading since you can't move the handle completely out of the way if using any of the top 3 headrest height positions. Another potential issue with a bigger child with longer legs could be the AntiRebound Bar. I'm not sure if it will pose any problems in the vehicle but it might get in the way more than anything else when using the carrier outside of the vehicle. For the record, it isn't removable as far as I can tell. My biggest issue with this seat right now is how difficult it is to tighten and loosen the harness straps when the headrest is in any of the lower height positions. It gets considerably easier when the headrest is in one of the tallest height settings. When the headrest is positioned higher, the harness routing is more direct less up and then down routing so that doesn't create as much friction and the harness is easier to tighten and loosen. Another issue with this seat is the plastic compound buckle. This type of buckle is the same one used on the BabyTrend infant seats and the lowend Dorel infant seats. Truthfully, I'm disappointed to see this type of buckle used on a premium product. I'm sure it's safe but it's definitely a cheaper component and more difficult to buckle and unbuckle than a standard buckle with metal tongues. Turn the red knob on the back of the shell and it retracts the holding pin from one of 7 holes on the track. Slide the headrest into the desired position and listen for the audible click that tells you it's secured in a locked position. Moving the straps from the bottom harness slot to the upper harness slot is simple as well but it involves a few steps. First move the adjustable headrest into the highest position to line up the openings in both the shell and the headrest. Now remove the straps from the splitter plate and pull them free.

Lower the headrest position until the upper harness slots in the headrest line up with the opening in the shell. Rethread the harness straps and reattach them to the splitter plate. Now raise or lower the headrest into the desired position. It didn't give me much trouble when it was on the floor in the house but when it was installed in either of our vehicles it gave me a hard time both attaching and detaching on several occasions. It was kind of hit or miss with the issue and I'm really not sure why. Regardless, when attaching the carrier to the base make absolutely sure that both sides of the carrier click and lock into the base. B and C positions are only usable positions when the headrest does not extend beyond the shell. If the headrest is in any of the top 3 height settings it will interfere with the handle's ability to move past the top of the headrest. Remove the lower LATCH connectors from their storage compartment on the base, lengthen the strap and route it under the guide in the middle of the base, attach the pushon LATCH connectors to the vehicle's lower LATCH anchors make sure the "up" side of the connector is on top, apply some pressure to the base with your hand compressing it into the vehicle seat cushion while you simultaneously tighten the belt and that should result in a secure installation. Really, the most difficult part of the process was determining which setting to use on the adjustable base in order to get the liquid bubble in the most appropriate range on the recline indicator. There was a large gap the near the area of the seat bight, however the seat was installed tightly and I didn't feel that pool noodles or rolled towels were necessary to stabilize the seat in that position. Just remember that you have to lock your seatbelt in some way since you don't have the lockoff device if you're not using the base. Read your vehicle owner's manual for information on how to properly install a child restraint with the seatbelts in your vehicle.

Fortunately, since this was a captain's chair, I had the option of moving the vehicle seat into a boltupright position and that eliminated the gap issue. The Shuttle 33 instruction manual does state on pg 34 "If vehicle seat back is adjustable, adjust vehicle seat back into most upright position". Again, installation both with and without the base was simple and easy. Space is more of an issue in this vehicle than it is in the minivan and I could not move the driver's seat all the way back on the seat track with the Shuttle 33 installed behind it in the more reclined position. However, the driver's seat was still in a comfortable position for my DH so it wasn't a major space problem, IMO. Having the seat installed more upright 2033 lb range should generate more room for the driver or front seat passenger. In this case it didn't make any difference at all because of the height and contour of the drivers seat. Just don't count on similar outcomes in other vehicles. As you can see in the picture below, I was able to fit my entire hand in that gap. This is likely to diminish the effectiveness of the ARB but hopefully it will still help to reduce rebound movement in a frontal crash. Using the seat without the base positioned the ARB much closer to the vehicle seatback. The weight and height limits should translate into extended use for most children which makes the Shuttle 33 a good value

for the price. The obvious attention to detail and additional safety features are impressive. However, the seat does have quirks and a few ease-of-use issues. For an experienced parent who isn't reluctant to employ some tricks or take an extra few seconds to make sure everything is correct, none of the Shuttle 33 issues should be dealbreakers. Although truthfully, for first-time inexperienced parents, it's probably not going to be the easiest seat to use properly every single time.

I also wouldn't recommend this seat to someone who was expecting to have, or has already had, a very small or premature baby. However, if the Shuttle 33 fits your needs, fits your child, fits well in your vehicle and you're aware of its quirks then it may very well be the perfect infant seat for you and your most precious cargo! If it is not touching, and that far apart, do you think it will reduce the effectiveness or void it completely? Unfortunately, I don't really know the answer. I know the anti-rebound bar doesn't touch the vehicle seat cushion in every vehicle. But we can only speculate on how that will or won't affect rebound management. If you tip the seat back when it's properly installed on its base, how far does it rotate before the anti-rebound bar limits the movement. That's going to offer you some insight on how it might rebound. Honestly, if you are otherwise happy with the seat then I would say don't sweat it. When rear-facing the harness straps need to be coming from below the child's shoulders. The premie and newborn pics you had showed the harness straps coming from well over the shoulders. It's simply not safe if that is how it fits new babies. I'm currently using this seat and can let you know that we love it so much. My husband loved it because of the 4 steel locking system and the polymer buckles. The puzzle piece center buckle never was an issue for us and never was a reason why we would get rid of the seat. His feet hardly touch the rebound bar and it's easy to get him in and out of. He was born 7 lbs 7 oz and fit in this seat so snug when we brought him home. I love the rebound bar feature and now looking for his next big boy rear-facing seat and the rebound bar is a major requirement for me. I'm so glad I bought this seat. I am an inexperienced, about-to-be new mom, who DOES want ease of installation and some of these quirks might bother me. In other words, which one do you think is best.

Thank you, Jessica Or can it be positioned facing back and forward? My wife curses each time we have to use it, and NO you don't just get used to it. I know first hand how long these things take to write, so I really appreciate you taking the time. I purchased this infant seat, but I think I'm going to exchange it for a Chicco KeyFit 30 series seat. That the plastic harness points were a bad choice. What attracted me to the Combi was the Anti-Rebound Bar and the fact that it would fit nicely with the lightweight and ultrafoldable Combi stroller. Which is why I think I am going to end up exchanging this for a Chicco model. This is the model currently being sold without the base as an institutional program seat as the "Navette". I always hesitate to say things like "the ONLY" when writing these reviews because new products and updated products pop up so frequently. You never know what will debut next week or say, at ABC Kids Expo. I think rebound management is getting more attention lately and I fully expect to see more manufacturers addressing the issue in their new and revised products. These are the rules you must follow to restrain your children safely. Every seat and vehicle is different, which affects the way you'll install your particular seat. Check to make sure there are no twists in the seat belt. The base should not move side-to-side or front-to-back more than 1 inch. Harness straps should lie flat, not twisted, and be placed through the slots located at or below your child's shoulders. The harness is snug enough when you cannot pinch any extra material at the shoulder.

Always buckle the baby in the seat first, and then place coats or blankets over the harness. This

holds the harness straps in place on the child's chest and shoulders. These seats typically have weight and height limits for the rearfacing position that allow you to keep your child rearfacing longer. Krupa 3.0 out of 5 stars I liked the extra head support as compared to other seats but then that is expected for the premium price over a Graco seat. As it turns out, the factory went ahead and retrofitted the necessary part before shipping it out to Amazon.com; there are green inspection stickers on the carrier unit and box indicating this but we had to call Combi to find out that's what it meant. Even though they fixed it before I ever received the car seat, I am deducting one star for not including CLEAR notification with the unit that it was already fixed.

Otherwise, the release mechanism for detaching the car seat from the car seat base requires about as much effort as any other unit from Combi's competitors; my wife's small hands can just manage it. Weightwise it was a tad lighter than others one selling point. The rollbar at the foot of the car seat is a feature that no one else seems to offer another selling point. It integrates with the Helio stroller to form a travel system see my review on the Helio the final selling point for my wife. We get compliments on it everytime we go out with it. We have the Combi stroller as well and it's been great. My son fits very well in the seat and usually nods off straight away. The release from the base was very hard to pull at first, but after a few weeks it has gotten much better. I would buy this seat again. It looks really stylish and is pretty light compared to the other ones we looked at. I had trouble getting it out of the base at first but after taking it to the fire department they showed me how to do it and also after reading the instruction manual it explains that you have to pull the car seat straight up not at an angle otherwise it stays locked in place for safety reasons. The only thing I had trouble with is that I had to use 2 hands to pull the latch in the back up but I suppose I always found that as a positive thing. I'll accept a little bit of inconvenience if it means that my child will be safer in the long run. The thing is a beast. We are going to be using a toddler seat soon and I am very sad to let this one go. I loved this car seat. It is extremely safe and my daughter snoozed better in this car seat

than she ever did anywhere else. I definitely recommend, but as with EVERY car seat you need to read the manual that comes with it. Though Could Use Some TuneUps People ask if its the pricey bugaboo. Its compact and easy to carry though I should definitely have been doing some bicep exercises prebaby. Our baby has always seemed comfortable in it.

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
